Tutoring

If your student is participating in tutoring, remember that tutoring comes first.

Enrollment

- Enrollment for all students **begins Monday, September 21, 2015.**
- Enrollment for all students **ends Wednesday, September 23, 2015.**
- Classes are filled on a first come, first served basis.
- **Bring your registration with payment to the Enrichment Box located in the Fairmount Park Elementary office.**
- **Time/date stamp your registration form in the appropriate area to indicate the order in which your student's registration form was submitted.**
- You will receive confirmation—letter or email—that your child is enrolled in a class. **Please do not send your child to class without written confirmation of his/her enrollment.**
- If a class does not enroll sufficiently, it may be cancelled. You will be notified and your fees refunded.
- Volunteers: One volunteer is helpful for each class. Volunteers will help with signing students in and out of class, as well as helping instructors.
- **Correspondence regarding any/all matters for the enrichment class should be directly with the enrichment teacher.**
- **Parents are responsible to add to their calendar the start and end of each enrichment class their student is registered.**
- **Please note, for classes that fill up, we will form a wait list of students that do not get in. The students on the wait list will have priority enrollment if they sign up for the same class the following session. In addition, classes that have running wait lists will prioritize students who have not participated in the class before returning students can re-enroll.**
- **Waitlist will dissolve after spring session.**

Snack and Clothing

- Each child should bring a small, easy to eat snack on class days to be eaten in the hallway and not in classrooms.
- Please send your children with clothing appropriate for their classes. Athletic and dance classes require loose-fitting clothes and closed-toe rubber-soled shoes. Art can be messy! Please bring an old shirt or a smock.

Drop Off and Pick Up

- **Morning Enrichment classes: parents need to be with their student until the enrichment teacher has signed them into the class. Courtyard doors will lock at 7:40am.**
- After school students are expected to transfer independently to an Enrichment class. Teachers are given a class list at the beginning of each session, but they are not responsible for delivering students to their enrichment classes. If you think this may be a challenge for your child, please contact the coordinator and we will try to arrange a "student buddy" to assist your child.
- Parents are responsible for collecting their children promptly from afternoon classes.
- There will be no supervision for children after their class ends.
- If prompt pick up becomes an issue, your student may be removed from the class without refund for remaining classes.
- Please make arrangements for pickup prior to enrolling your child in an after-school class.
- No bus transportation can be offered for Enrichment Program classes occurring before and after school.

Behavior

At Fairmount Park Elementary, we have the expectation of respect for teachers/instructors and good behavior during classes. Students are expected to maintain the same behavioral standards that they have during the formal school day. If an instructor identifies a behavior issue, the following steps will be taken:

- At the first incident, the instructor will contact parents/ guardians regarding student behavior.
- The student will be given one trial class to improve.
- If the disruptive behavior continues, the instructor reserves the right to remove the student from the class without refund for remaining classes. Please discuss enrollment with your child to be sure they want to attend an after-school class.

Financial Aid

Our intent is that all students have the ability to participate in our Enrichment Program. ***Students who are eligible for the Free and Reduced Lunch program may enroll in an Enrichment class for \$15. We are limited to only one class request per qualifying student per quarter.*** The ability to grant aid is based on the amount of money voluntarily donated to the program and by the generosity of our vendors and instructors who offer scholarship positions in their classes. We reserve the right to grant or deny all requests for financial aid.

Class Fee

Class fees are set by our vendors and this program does not generate any profits. Class registrations managed by the Fairmount Park Elementary Enrichment Program include a non-refundable \$15 fee for administrative and financial aid costs.

Have you ever wondered about all the modern marvels that we see around us and take for granted? Would you like a better understanding of how they work - be structures such as towers, bridges, or buildings or machines that transport us here on earth or those that take us into space? Students will collaborate or work individually to design creative and original solutions to a series of engineering challenges by building models using easily accessible everyday materials. Some of the proposed challenges will have the students create and build designs that are physical and hands-on. Others will involve designing products with 3D software with the opportunity to send the designs out for 3D printing, and each student will get to keep their printed object. Some of the content taught in these sessions can be advanced and academically challenging for 1st Graders. Kindly reach out to the instructors (falconeers@outlook.com) to confirm if your child is a fit for this class.

Each season with Engineering Challenge the physical modeling component typically works around a general theme. This fall we will be exploring basic tension structures. To begin the session we will learn several basic knots which will allow the students to effectively use string and chords in their designs. These foundational skills will be used in challenges with objects such as simple guyed towers and suspension bridges. If time allows we plan to include an open ended challenge near the end of the session to test all of our new skills. This more difficult challenge may extend through two or more sessions and will be either a free spanning bridge or a self-deploying escape line.
