FROM MS BREIDENBACH, BUDGET MEETING AND MORE...

First and foremost, please remember to join me tonight from 6:30-7:30pm in the school lunchroom. I will share the 2017-18 budget and staffing documents and explain the cuts and changes that are anticipated. It's going to be a challenging budget/staffing period and your feedback is needed. I ask that one parent please attend per household. K-5 student care will be available for single parents or households where the second parent is unable to be home with their children. Please be sure to have your child bring reading materials to occupy them during this time. Ms. Ensign and Ms. Christl will supervise students in the music room. I do want to speak candidly during this meeting and ask that children not be present in the lunchroom.

Monday was an all-time favorite day in the lunchroom with K-3 students. A dozen or so students presented their newly acquired library cards. Yes!!! During break they had heeded my call to "bug" their parents for a trip to the library to sign up for their very own library cards. Every child should have one and should use it at a branch library a few times a month to check out great books and use the computers to access DreamBox. Our country's public libraries are truly a national treasure. Please use them frequently!

Tremendous thanks to the PTA for funding Book-It Theatre's performance of *Goin' Somewhere Special* on Friday, February 17th. The story put a human face on and brought human feelings to the effects of the Jim Crow laws of the 1950s. Please take a few minutes to ask your child to tell you more about the story and the subsequent classroom discussion.

I would also like to thank the team of dedicated auction volunteers who have poured hundreds of hours into planning our upcoming auction. Thank you, thank you, thank you! In my thirty-three years in K-12 public education I have seen a gradual decrease in support services, especially in recent years. Having a counselor in every school should not have to depend on auctions and annual drives, but the support is highly valued in the meantime. We simply wouldn't be a functional building without it. I continue to have faith that the McCleary Decision will reverse this trend in the near future.

The closure of I-5 on Monday certainly taught us a thing or two about having emergency plans in place. COUNSELOR'S CORNER WITH MRS. PENDERGRASS

10 Things to Say to Kids Every Day

Upon returning from this past mid-winter break, I sure noticed how our kindergartners have gotten bigger! They're obviously growing as learners as well. Through Second Step lessons, they are most definitely developing and practicing social-emotional skills such as understanding and showing empathy. They are learning how to use words to repair relationships and how to go beyond just noticing feelings by offering help, or even just a kind word.

I know plenty of adults who could benefit from the social skills lessons Fairmount Park kids are experiencing! Our world would be a more peaceful place if we'd all take a moment to consider what it's like to "walk in another's shoes," to be ready with a word of encouragement rather than criticism, to step up and help someone in need, or perhaps even to be willing to make a new friend.

While connecting or reconnecting to others can be difficult, sometimes our greatest challenges are due to negative communication ruts with the people with whom we do everyday life. Some of us need to start by looking at the person in the mirror. Are we expecting respectful tones from our kids when we take rude or bossy tones with them? Do we forget to say "please" and "thank you" while we demand to hear it? I remember taking a big bite of dinner once and then promptly barking at one of my sons to please stop talking with his mouth full! Oops!

Beyond our tone, there are plenty of things we should stop saying to and around our kids as well, whether it is name-calling or using inappropriate language in their presence. I'm sure you don't need those words spelled out! Instead, check yourself on these 10 positive things kids need to hear every day, and note why:

- Thank you – Acknowledges effort
- Tell me more – Show you are listening and that you would like to hear more. This encourages conversation without judgment or giving immediate advice.
- You can do it! – Say you believe in them.
- How can I help? – Let them know you are willing and available to help.
- Let's pitch in! – Demonstrate you're willing to collaborate and believe in teamwork.
- (Hugs) – Show of affection: pat on the back, high 5's... much needed human connection.
- Please – The "magic word" acknowledges that you are asking for a certain behavior that will help you and/or make you happy.
- Good Job! – Encourages self-respect – rewards effort. Say, "You should be very proud of that," as well as "I'm proud of you."
- It's time to... – We need structure to our daily lives.
- I love you – Everyone needs love and affection and feeling of acceptance and belonging. We can't assume they know (or believe) this.
